

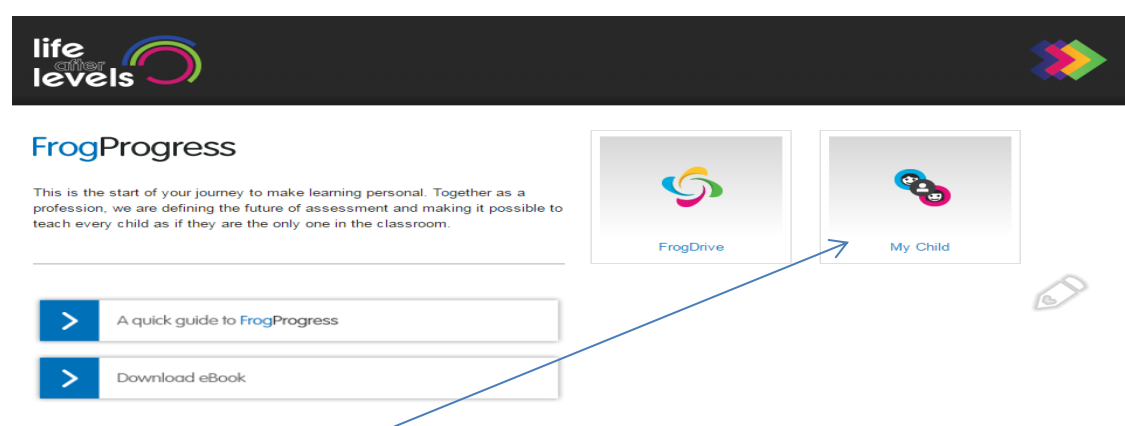
## Parents' User Guide - 'Frog - My Child'

Web address: <https://northburn-northumberland.frogos.net>

Type the above web address into a net browser e.g. Google Chrome, Safari, Microsoft Edge (but *not* Internet Explorer). Alternatively follow the link from the school website: Curriculum – How to access FROG.

Once you get onto the log-on page, enter your *username*, which is supplied with your child's report and your password. (Passwords are set initially as 1234. Please change this to something memorable on first log-on.)

Once logged-on, you will see 2 squares:



Click on the *My Child* block to access information about your child's progress in individual subjects over the year.

### What does the report show?

Accessing *My Child* will show, on a half-term by half-term basis, which areas of learning your child has covered and the standards achieved. The standards are:

- Blue** - achieved at greater depth, working beyond age-related expectations for year group.
- Green** - achieved, working at age-related expectations the year group standard.
- Red** - covered but working below, working below age-related expectations the year group standard.
- Purple** – KPI to be re-visited as a result of COVID-19 disruption to learning.

In the early parts of the year, some areas of learning (objectives) are shown as **orange**. These are objectives that have been covered but still require additional coverage to reach the year group standard by the end of the year. (By Summer 2 - the second part of summer term and end of the academic year - all **orange** will either become **green**, **blue**, **purple** or **red**.)

## **A note on Purple**

COVID-19 has had a huge impact on society as a whole and this has been mirrored in the impact of learning in schools.

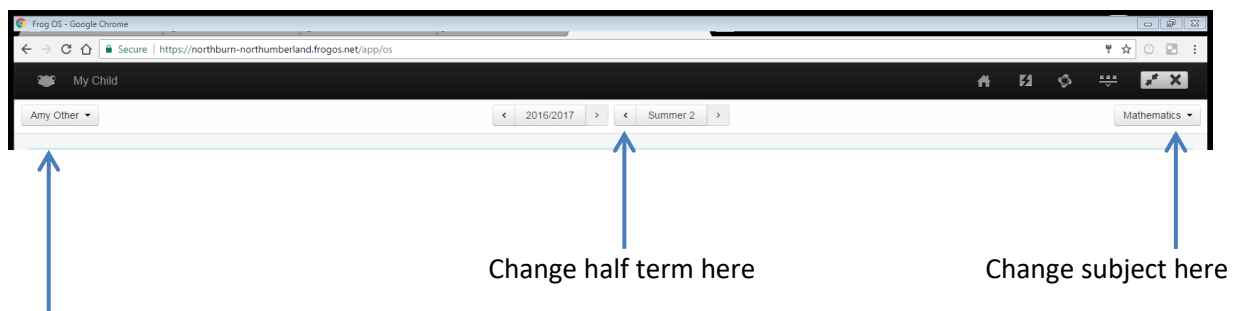
While every effort has been made by both you and school staff to minimise this impact, it will have made a difference to the learning of your children. (On FROG, we have introduced the **purple** colour to indicate aspects of learning that have been most affected.)

This may mean that an area of learning has been missed but it will be covered in subsequent years. However, it may be that the missed area of learning will be superseded by another in the next phase of learning as teachers are continually adapting their delivery to ensure all pupils reach the highest standard they can in this area when it is re-visited. (The curriculum at Northburn Primary generally spirals, and areas are re-visited in greater depth in subsequent key stages.)

In some rare cases, it may mean that an area of missed learning will be missed altogether - this would only be the case where it is an area of learning that won't have a significant impact on pupils' long-term education. (The reasoning behind missing it out is to avoid pupil overload in a crowded curriculum.)

## **How do I change subject or half term?**

Use the drop down tab shown to change subject and the arrows to change the half term.



## **What if I have more than one child in school?**

You can switch between children using the drop down tab shown in the top left of the screen above.

## **What about other areas of my child's development?**

You will also receive an *End of Year Report* about your child which focusses on their approaches to learning, special events they have been involved in, and targets for next year. This *End of Year Report* is where your child's teacher/s provide/s as much information as possible about your child as they develop throughout their time in school.
